The Niagara Region has a rich francophone history and Francophones have made significant economic and cultural contributions. Five francophone women who have chosen to make Niagara their home share their involvement in the area.

Francophone presence in the Niagara Region has a long history and continues to vibrate. In the nineteenth century Francophones settled in the city of Welland to help with the construction of the canal. Francophones from Quebec were later recruited for employment in the local cotton mill.. Today new francophone immigrants, mostly from Africa, bring their cultures and voices to Niagara. In this episode we hear from five francophone women who are actively engaged in cultural venues in the area. First we hear from Lucie Huot, whose family came from Quebec. Next we are introduced to Fété Ngira-Batware Kimpiobi and Nafée Faigou, both from the Association of Francophone Immigrant Women of Niagara (SOFIFRAN). Fété and Nafée speak about their immigration to Canada, what they have left in their native countries and what they like in Niagara. Our next guest is Rachel Hélène Amran, an artist from Montréal who shares her efforts for a successful integration as a francophone artist. Next we meet Clamenç Prades, who relates her experience when she arrived from Austria about ten years ago and decided to go all French.
