Suzanne invited us to attend a bus trip to the Mush Hole Residential School Museum in Brantford, Ontario and immediately, our documentary blossomed into the collection of wise, humble, progressive and inclusive voices that are featured in our documentary.

This documentary seeks to **Break the Barriers** that deter progressive negotiations between these groups by voicing underlying attitudes and revealing common points.
